He was an Area Commander for a couple of years and then moved to Admin for 4 ½ years and then to the Special Ops unit for 2 years and has been back in the Area Commander program and on Patrol for 4 to 5 months.

Last time he was Area Commander he oversaw area 2 which is from Foothill north to the 210 Freeway. Throughout this Police experience he has worked in units such as the traffic unit several times, crime prevention, School Resource officer and of course in the patrol division.

**Questions and Concerns of the Residents of Area 3:**

***People are using Encina as a bypass for the lights that were installed at Palmetto and San Bernadino. They are speeding mainly 5-8 am daily.*** Officer Gissel advised he will let the traffic unit know so they can keep an eye on it.

***On Seville and Juniper right across the street from the park there is very poor lighting and every time they go for a walk they smell marijuana. Even during the day there are people smoking it in the restrooms.***

***Lives in the townhomes on Seville and Juniper, there are people constantly loitering in the parking lot. They have called the management and they just say to call the police. They do not***

***like to call the police because they are scared their names will be repeated. They are at the condos at 16600 Seville. People urinate outside you can smell it.*** Lt. Rodriguez advised we will look into the issues at the condos. We can do extra patrols. If you do call our dispatch your name will not be repeated but if it makes you feel better you don't even have to give them your name we will respond either way if we get the call.
