Virtual Archeology Tour

Archeology in simple terms is the study of the past by looking at artifacts and other various objects left by the people in the past or by animals. For example we know dinosaurs existed because of the discovery and study of their bones.

In this activity students will look at past artifacts **via the internet** from various parts of the world and create a passport booklet with drawings of the artifacts labeled with the country it was discovered in. *For a challenge students are encouraged to also write an interesting fact on the artifacts.*

Materials:

- Internet access
- 2-3 blank sheets papers depending on how many pages student wants.
- Scissors
- Glue (stick preferred) **or** stapler
- Markers, crayons, or colored pencils

Instructions:

1. Grab pieces of paper and fold horizontally. Open papers and cut with scissors on crease to create the pages for the booklet.
2. Get glue or stapler and put pages together to create the booklet. (if using glue allow enough time for glue to dry) ***see example below***
3. Decorate cover page the same as an american passport or to the preference of student. Students can research how passports look via the internet or parents can show them a physical copy.
4. Research online. With the help of an adult or supervisor students can search online with key words to discover archeology finds from various countries. **For example: mummies from egypt or archeology finds from south america. Etc.**
5. Once research is done students then can draw and color the artifact they found interesting in their passport booklet.
