WHO CAN REGISTER SOMEONE IN THE FONTANA POLICE DEPARTMENT'S VULNERABLE PERSONS REGISTRY?

Our registry is for vulnerable persons who reside with the city limits of Fontana. A vulnerable person themself, a parent, caregiver, legal guardian, or other legal authority (Power of Attorney, Court Order, etc.) can use the registry. Only the vulnerable person being registered must live within our jurisdiction.

You will be asked to declare your authority to enter someone into the registry. You must meet one of the following relationships conditions:

- self
- Parent or guardian of a child under 18 years of age (i.e., a minor)
- Other legal authority (e.g., Power of Attorney, court order, etc.)

Parent/Guardian: If you are a parent or guardian registering a minor, by submitting the minor's information you are attesting to your legal authority to disclose the minor's mental health and medical information to the Fontana Police Department for purposes of the Registry. Under state law, a minor may obtain a right to privacy to his or her mental health information at age 12, and to his or her medical care information at age 16. If the minor has obtained such privacy rights, you must obtain consent from the minor to submit his or her health information to the Registry.

Other Legal Authority: For registrants that are 18 years of age or older or lack legal capacity to register themselves, by submitting the registrant's personal information, including medical information, you are attesting that you have legal authority to disclose the registrant's personal information to the Fontana Police Department for purposes of the Registry based on one of the following representations:

- I have the registrant's permission and consent and the registrant has the capacity to give it; or
- I have a valid and unrevoked authorization or Power of Attorney that was made when the registrant had legal capacity; or I have a court's authorization/appointment or other legal authority pursuant to California law
